EXAMINATION PATTERN 2017-18

As per current circular issued by the CBSE New Delhi. We have adopted following pattern of Examination with marginal change for class 1 to VIII.

For whole of the academic session we are conducting 4 Assessments altogether divided in to 3 periodic tests each carrying twenty marks (20)of which weightage 10 marks and one final examination at the end of session carrying 80 marks. Each test will be organised at an interval of three months.

Evaluation /Assessment

Each class test of 20 marks will be organised as pen paper test which ten marks will be taken as weightage marks. Average of the two best tests (10 marks) will be added to 80 marks of session ending examination covering 100% syllabus. Rest 10 marks will be taken from assessment of regularity, assignment completion and neatness and up keep of note book. Thus each subject will be assessed at 100 marks.

Note book submission (5 marks) as a part of internal assessment is aimed at enhancing seriousness of students towards preparing notes for the topics being taught in the class room as well as assignment. This also addresses the critical aspect of regularity, punctuality, neatness and note book up keep.

Subject enrichment activities (5 marks) are subject application activities aimed at enrichment of the understanding and skill development. These activities are to be recorded internally by respective subject teacher.

For Languages

1. Activities conducted for subject enrichment in Languages should aim at equipping the learner to develop effective speaking and listening skills.

For Maths

2. The listed laboratory activities and projects prescribed by CBSE/NCERT.

For science

3. The listed practical works/activities.

For social science

4:- Map and project work.

Co-scholastic activities (work education, art education, health and physical education) will be assessed on a 5 point grading scale (a to e) without any descriptive indicator.

Discipline (attendance, sincerity, behaviour & values) will also be assessed on 5 points grading scales (a to e).

The internal assessment comprising 20 marks (10+5+5) entails objectivity and structured approach. For holistic assessment our teachers are efficient and devoted to make it an effective tool.

A student is evaluated finally at end of the session on the basis of overall performance in scholastic as well as co-scholastic areas in a complete academic session
